What does Rollup mean, and how does it affect reporting?

Rollup is the act of consolidating (adding up) units in the hierarchy. It only applies to rollup units. For example, when a base unit's budget is updated, the rollup unit will not reflect those changes until it has been rolled up. In other words, a report for the rollup unit may not equal the sum of the units beneath it if a rollup is pending.

There are three areas that show if the unit needs to be rolled up:

- On the **Versions** page, when you select a rollup unit you will see a red flag in the status column.

To run up-to-date reports, make sure to "rollup" the parent unit first. This can be done on the Status page, by highlighting a rollup unit, then clicking **Rollup** (shown above), and is completed on a version by version basis.
