Did you know?

How do I setup a process for forecasting in BudgetPak?

Before starting a forecasting process in BudgetPak, finance or the BudgetPak administrator should decide on which approach is right for their organization.

Here are some considerations:

- **Frequency** - how often will a forecast be completed
- **Level of Detail** - there are two types of forecast versions to choose from:
 - *Forecast* - choose this type when forecasting at the account level is sufficient
 - *Detailed Forecast* - choose this type when there are many changes throughout the year to employees, and/or the level of detail for assets and line item detail monthly numbers are critical.
- **Version Control** - how many versions to maintain throughout process
- **Who should be involved** - all budget holders or just the budget office/finance

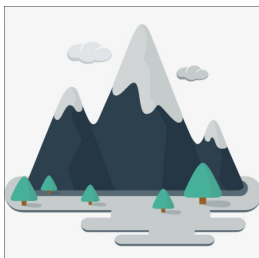
These considerations will help develop the overall forecast process for your organization, and determine what maintenance will be needed in order to complete the process.

Here are the steps for maintenance of your forecast process in BudgetPak:

1. Create the first forecast version of the year
2. Start the forecast
3. Ongoing updates to the forecast (depending on your frequency)
 - Upload new month(s) of actuals
 - Depending on version control from above, choose to adjust the forecast to include new month(s) of actuals OR create a new forecast version
4. Repeat step 3 according to the frequency of your process
